FINANCE OFFICE

Calendar Year-End Filing Requirements: As the end of the calendar year approaches, you are reminded of the following required annual filings:

- **Donations** – Provide donors with written confirmation for all contributions by January 31.
- **Payroll** – Furnish each employee a completed W-2 by January 31. File the W-3 transmittal form with the Social Security Administration by February 28.
- **Non-Payroll Payments** – Provide individuals or entities to whom you made payments of \$600 or more during the calendar year for services, rents, commissions, fees or other non-employee payments with Form 1099 by January 31. File copy A of each Form 1099 with the IRS by February 28.

A more complete description of these annual filings, along with instructions for reconciliation between the W-2s, W-3, and the quarterly Form 941 will be sent to the pastors and bookkeepers in mid-December.
